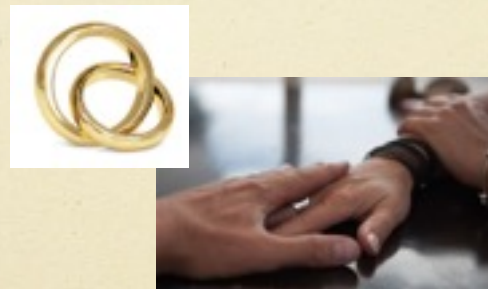
**Rev. Bill Ross
